Border Paving Construction Technologies Scholarship – Awarded to the senior high students who achieves excellent standing in construction technology courses at the advanced module level and who pursues post secondary studies at a technical institute in construction related fields. In the event that there is not a candidate meeting this criteria, excellence in RAP will be considered.

Charles Robertson Memorial Scholarship – Awarded to a student who demonstrates diversity, is co-operative with fellow students and teachers, and is registered in a post-secondary technical training institution.

Commerce Scholarship - Awarded to a student pursuing post secondary studies, preferably in business, but not necessarily.

Business Scholarship – Awarded to student with excellent marks enrolled in post secondary studies, preferably in a business program, but not necessarily.

HARRY COLLINGE GRADE TWELVE HONOUR STUDENTS

Harry Collinge Academic Honours

Grade 12 Academic Honours Certificates are awarded to those students who achieve an average of 80% or higher calculated using academic subjects from the following categories:

- English Language Arts 30-1 or Social Studies 30-1
- any three of the following: English Language Arts 30-1; Social Studies 30-1; Math 30-1; Math 30-2; Math 31; Science 30; Biology 30; Chemistry 30; Physics 30
- one additional five-credit Grade 12 course (which may be a Fine Arts or Second Language)
- **Note: Work Experience, Physical Education 30 and Career Technology Studies modules will not be considered for the fifth course.**
- **All courses must be taken at HCHS** and students must have submitted all marks for an Alberta High School Diploma by August 15.

Academic honours students must achieve at least 50% in all other subjects taken during the school year. **A student who qualifies for an Academic Honours Certificate is not eligible for the General Honours Certificate.**

Grade 12 Academic Scholarships – Awarded to the students with the two highest averages who are in attendance at a post-secondary institution.

Teck Coal Ltd. (\$500 each)

Grade 12 Academic Honours – Recognizes students who meet the above criteria but have taken course(s) outside of Harry Collinge, thus are not eligible for Harry Collinge Academic Honours.

Harry Collinge General Honours

Grade 12 General Honours Certificates are awarded to those students who achieved an average of 80% or higher calculated from the following courses which includes non-academic subjects:

- English Language Arts 30-1/2 or Social Studies 30-1/2
- any four additional five-credit Grade 12 courses
- **Note: Work Experience 35, one RAP 35 course, Physical Education 30 and the collection of any five Career Technology Studies modules at the 30 level are considered to be a five-credit Grade 12 course**
- **All courses must be taken at HCHS** and students must have submitted all marks for an Alberta High Diploma by August 15.

General honours students must achieve at least 50% in all other subjects taken during the school year.

General Proficiency Scholarship – Awarded to the student of highest standing for the General Honours Certificate.

Town Of Hinton (\$500)

Grade 12 General Honours – Recognizes students who meet the above criteria but have taken course(s) outside of Harry Collinge, thus are not eligible for a Harry Collinge General Honours.

Bilingual Certificate Recipients

At HCHS the goal of the FRIM program is functional bilingualism. Upon completion of 20 credits in senior courses taken in French, the student is awarded a GYPSD Certificate of Bilingualism at graduation in recognition of this accomplishment.

Registered Apprentices Recipients

The Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) follows the guidelines set out by Alberta Education. High school students divide their time between an approved work site and a high school program where they study English Language Arts, Social Studies, Science and Mathematics in order to earn their Alberta High School Diploma. RAP students must earn 40 credits which equals 1000 hours in their apprenticeship to be a graduate of the Registered Apprenticeship Program.

Aboriginal Recipients

HCHS in partnership with the Friendship Centre wish to celebrate the Aboriginal heritage of the following students as they graduate from high school. The Friendship Centre presents each student with an eagle feather, which is highly valued by the Aboriginal people. The eagle soars gracefully in the sky, traveling close to the sun and our creator; it is considered a messenger and link between the Aboriginal people and the creator. To earn the gift of an eagle feather is a great honour. This gift marks a monumental and joyous occasion in a young person's life and our Aboriginal community.

CREDIT ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Credit Achievement Award provides the opportunity for students who may not earn academic scholarship, but who demonstrate a strong work ethic, good character and have a good attendance record to be recognized with a monetary award. Students who earn between 125 and 140 credits at Harry Collinge will be eligible for this award. The credit achievement award will be paid out by the end of January in the semester following the conclusion of the student's grade 12 year. In creating citizens of tomorrow Harry Collinge believes that a well rounded program of studies creates improved student learning, high levels of citizenship, and helps students to become life-long learners. ALEXANDER RUTHERFORD SCHOLARSHIPS

The **Alexander Rutherford High School Achievement Scholarship** recognizes and rewards academic achievement at the high school level and encourages students to pursue post-secondary studies. The scholarship has a value of up to \$2,500 and is awarded to a student achieving a minimum average of 75% in five designated courses in at least one grade: Grade 10, 11 or 12. Recipients must be enrolled full-time in a post-secondary program for at least one semester in length or be an apprenticeship student. www.alis.alberta.ca/scholarships

GOVERNOR GENERAL'S MEDAL

The Governor General of Canada's Academic Medal was first awarded in 1873 by the Earl of Dufferin, and has since become one of the most prestigious awards that a student in a Canadian educational institution may receive. The Governor General of Canada continues this tradition of encouraging scholarships across Canada and recognizing outstanding students. The medal is awarded to the Grade 12 student with the highest academic honours in grades 11 and 12.

CARMICHAEL SCHOLARSHIPS

Don and Pearl Carmichael were long-time residents of Hinton, moving here in the 1950's and operating their jewelry store until the late 1970's. They bequeathed nearly \$400,000 to endow a scholarship fund for HCHS graduates. Don and Pearl shared a deep concern for the education of the youth of Hinton and HCHS students who have shown promise for academic achievement and who have financial need will be the beneficiaries of their generosity, love and care for many years to come.
